



In the neighborhood of Desire sits George Washington Carver High—a school devastated by Katrina. It was here that Athletic Director, Brian Bordainick had his own dream to create a state-of-the-art athletic facility. A true grassroots effort, the drive eventually caught the attention of the NFL and Nike. To date, the Field of Dreams project has raised \$1,499,500 of its \$1.85 million goal. GNOF is proud to house and administer the Field of Dreams Fund.



A DESIRE FOR A *THRIVING* COMMUNITY FOR ALL



The Terraces is a 200-unit community for seniors owned by Volunteers of America, made possible in part by a \$200,000 grant from GNOF's Community Revitalization Fund.



FAIRNESS



Imagine trying to negotiate the byzantine world of federal claims processing in the aftermath of the Gulf oil spill. Now, imagine trying to do it in a foreign language. Such is the plight of fishermen like Dan Do. Enter Sandy Nguyen, Executive Director of Coastal Communities Consulting. Sandy's group has provided much needed low-cost translation services and technical assistance to more than 1,200 fishermen, farmers, and small business owners for 15 years. Her job is made a little easier by a grant from GNOF's Gulf Coast Oil Spill Fund.

A DESIRE FOR OPPORTUNITY

The lifeblood of any economy is jobs. In New Orleans, the challenge is how to move a service-based workforce into the more technologically savvy workplace of the future. It begins with training. Partnering with the Mayor's office and the National Fund for Workforce Solutions, GNOF will receive a grant totaling \$600,000 with matching funds. GNOF will use this grant to support workforce training programs designed to prepare local workers for the thousands of jobs that will soon be generated in the biotech and healthcare sectors.




JUSTICE




